#### 4. TAMIL NADU AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY

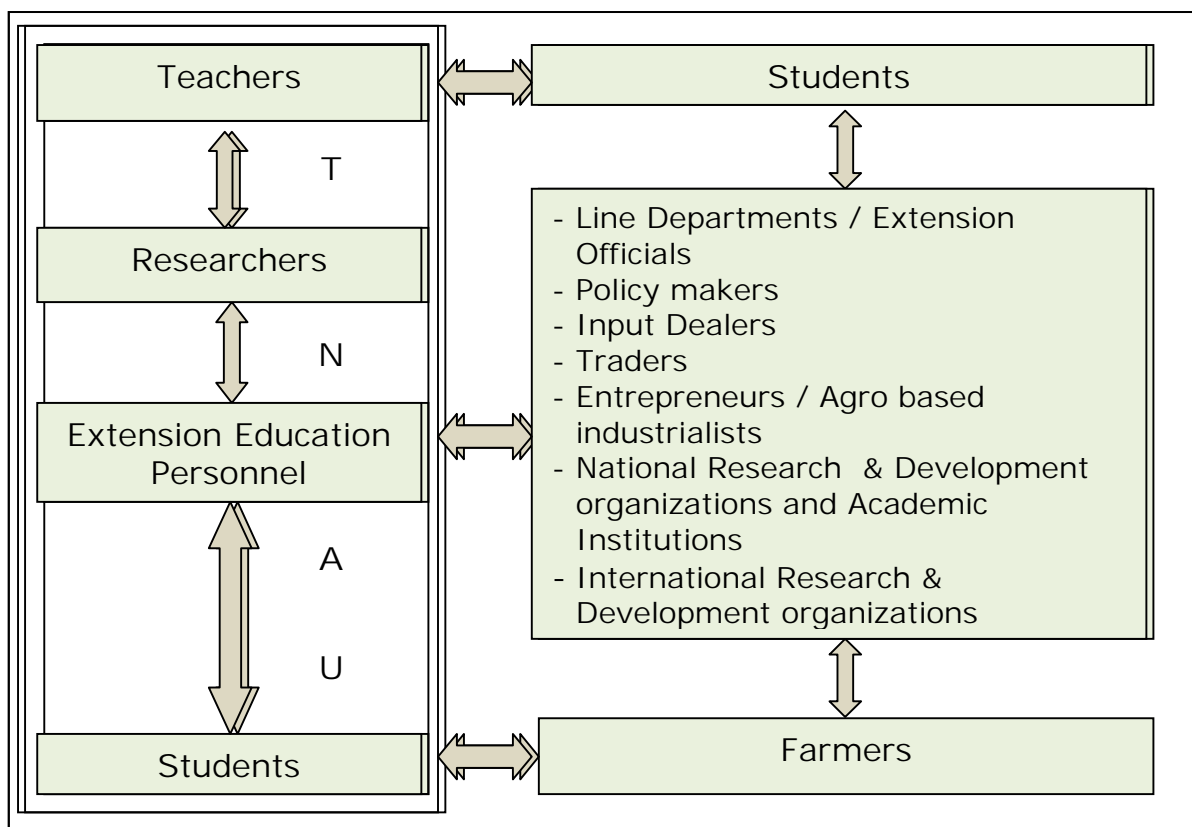
